



# Replacing a breaker in China in Afghanistan





## Overview

China will offer the Afghan Taliban tariff-free access to its vast construction, energy and consumer sectors, Beijing's envoy to Kabul said on Thursday, as the ailing resource-rich but diplomatically isolated regime looks to build up its markets. As part of its long-term focus on fostering economic and strategic cooperation, China's decision to remove tariffs on Afghan goods brings promising opportunities for Afghanistan's economy, says researcher Imran Zakeria. The withdrawal of US troops from Afghanistan in the summer of 2021 continues to be seen as a “black mark” on Joe Biden's presidency - a chaotic and deadly exit that left the war-torn country in a security vacuum as the Taliban swiftly advanced on Kabul. Two years on, Afghans are still struggling. On August 30, 2021, with celebratory fireworks lighting up the Kabul night sky, the US completed its withdrawal from Afghanistan, ending its 20-year presence in the country after its October 2001 invasion. Afghanistan has had two years to explore its own path for development. Certainly, China and Russia were seen as the main beneficiaries of the US. US President Donald Trump's freeze on foreign assistance programmes could leave a vacuum in Afghanistan for China to step into, but analysts say Beijing would be unwilling to do so.

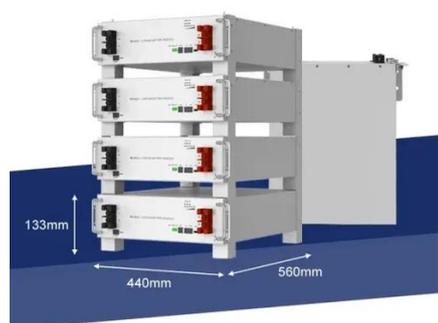
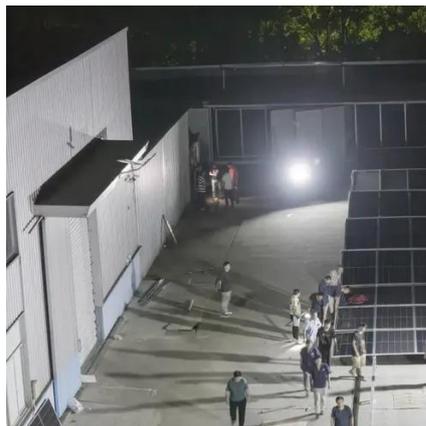

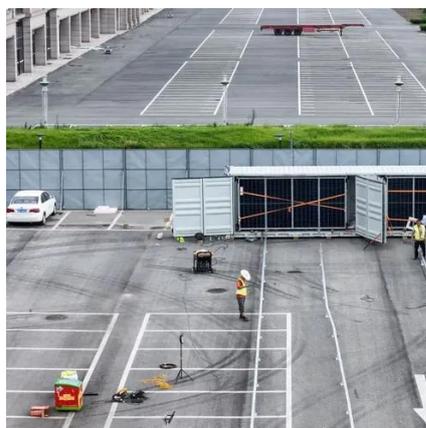
